SAILING RULES.

1.—All races to be sailed under the rules of the Y. R. A., by Amateur Crews.

2.—All boats entered in the race will be under the direction of the officer of the day, or in his absence by a member of the Sailing Committee, and all disputes that may arise shall be reported to him, and the Committee's decision shall be final.

3.—The officer of the day shall award the prizes.

4.—The officer of the day or the Sailing Committee shall have the power to alter the course or postpone any race.

5.—All boats, together with sails and spars, taking part in the race must be the property of the owner who is a member of the Club, and must be entered in the owner's name, and helmsman to be a bona fide amateur. Should an owner wish to sail another member's boat and has his own boat entered, he must obtain the permission of the Committee before doing so.

6.—Not more than one boat may be entered by any individual owner in the same race.

7.—All entries must be in the hands of the Sailing Secretary by the Thursday evening preceding the race, accompanied with entrance fee.

8.—Each boat shall carry a distinguishing flag as registered in the Club Register of Boats.

9.—All boats sailing in Club matches must if requested provide a certificate of measurement from the local official measures.

10.—Should any owner consider he had a fair ground of complaint against another boat for foul sailing or any other violation of the rules, he must signify the same to the officer of the day on the conclusion of the race, or he may place his complaint in writing and forward same to the Sailing Secretary within six hours, and must deposit 2s. 6d., which may be forfeited to the Club should the Sailing Committee so decide.

11.—The Sailing Secretary will call a meeting of the Sailing Committee as soon as possible to discuss such protest, and their decision shall be final.

12.—Sailing instructions will be placed on board in Club Room at least one hour before each race.

COURSES.

Course No. 1.

From Starting Line to Low-way Buoy, thence to Club Mark in Ray, back to starting line, all marks to be passed on Starboard hand. Twice round.

Course No. 2.

From Starting Line to mark off Joscelyn's Corner, thence to Club mark in Ray, back to Starting Line, all marks to be passed on Starboard hand. Twice round.
