

days' notice to each member, stating the purposes for which the meeting is called. Ten members to form a quorum. Minutes of the proceedings of all General and Committee Meetings shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose, and shall be signed by the Chairman.

### 13. INFRINGEMENT OF RULES.

Should any member commit an infringement of the Rules and Bye-laws of the Club, the Committee shall deal therewith as they in their absolute discretion think fit.

### 14. ALTERATION OF RULES.

The Rules shall not be altered, added to or rescinded, without the sanction of a majority of the members present in the proportion of two to one at the Annual or Special General Meeting. Notice of such alteration to be given in the Agenda concerning that Meeting.

## SAILING RULES.

---

---

1. All races to be sailed under the rules of the Y.R.A. Amateur crews only to be carried on yachts under 8 tons (TM).

2. All boats entered in the race will be under the direction of the officer of the day, or in his absence a member of the Sailing Committee.

3. The officer of the day or the Sailing Committee shall have the power to alter the course or postpone any race.

4. Every yacht entered for a race, together with her sails and spars, must be the bona fide property of the person or persons in whose name or names she is entered. Should an owner wish to sail another member's boat and has his own entered he must obtain the permission of the Committee before doing so.

5. Two or more yachts owned wholly, or in part by the same person or body shall not be entered in the same race without the previous consent of the Sailing Committee.

6. The number of persons allowed on boats 24ft. and under during a race shall be limited to four.

7. All entries must be in the hands of the Sailing Secretary at least 48 hours preceding the race, accompanied with entrance fee.

8. Each boat shall carry a distinguishing flag as registered in the Club Register of Boats.

9. All boats sailing in Club matches must, if requested provide a certificate of measurement from the local official measurers.

10. Should an owner consider he has a fair ground for complaint against another boat for foul sailing or any other violation of the rules, he must signify the same to the officer of the day on the conclusion of the race, or he may place his complaint in writing and forward same to the Sailing Secretary within six hours, and must deposit 2s. 6d. which may be forfeited to the Club should the Sailing Committee so decide.

11. The Sailing Secretary will call a meeting of the Sailing Committee as soon as possible to discuss such protest, and their decision shall be final.

12. Sailing instructions will be placed on board in Club Room at least one hour before each race.
